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## WISDOM WAVES



**Vinayak Krishna Gokak**

As history conveys past events, science discloses the facts and figures, mathematics deals with calculus and statistics, and literature is a field that showcases the cultural heritage through writings and compositions. Discovering the hidden gems of literature discloses a depth of wisdom intertwined with our own unique perception.

Here is an introduction to one such literary genius of Karnataka, Mr. Vinayak Krishna Gokak, a master of storytelling and a word wizard. Born on 9<sup>th</sup> August 1909, he received his primary education at Majid High School in Savanur, attended Karnataka College in Dharwada for literature, and earned an M.A. with first-class honours from the University of Oxford.

Mr. Gokak began his writing career with Kalopasaka, a collection of poems published in 1934, which is considered a pioneer in Kannada poetry. He wrote under the pen name 'Vinayaka' and has a lot of literary works to his credit that include Samudra Geethegalu, Baaladeguladalli, Abhyudaya, Urabha, and many more. His novel Samarasave Jeevana ranks as a classic in Kannada Navodaya literature. His writing embodies his thoughts on religion, culture, philosophy, and education. Furthermore, D. R. Bendre's works deeply influenced the writer in his earlier years.

In 1961, the Govt. of India honoured Mr. Gokak with the Padma Shri for his exceptional work on Dyaya-Prithvi (Heaven and Earth), which also received the prestigious Sahitya Akademi Award in the same year. Coming full circle, the writer also served as the president of the Sahitya Akademi from 1983 to 1987, where he headed the committee that fought for the first language status of the Kannada language in the Karnataka State.

Adding another feather to his cap, Mr. Gokak became the fifth writer to win the Jnanpith Award for Kannada Language in 1990 for his epic Bharath Sindhu Rashmi, a 35,000-line narrative on Aryo-Dravidian civilisation. His works and accomplishments paved the way for young artists to study literature and bask in its beauty. On 28<sup>th</sup> April 1992, the beloved writer passed away, leaving behind his literary blueprint.

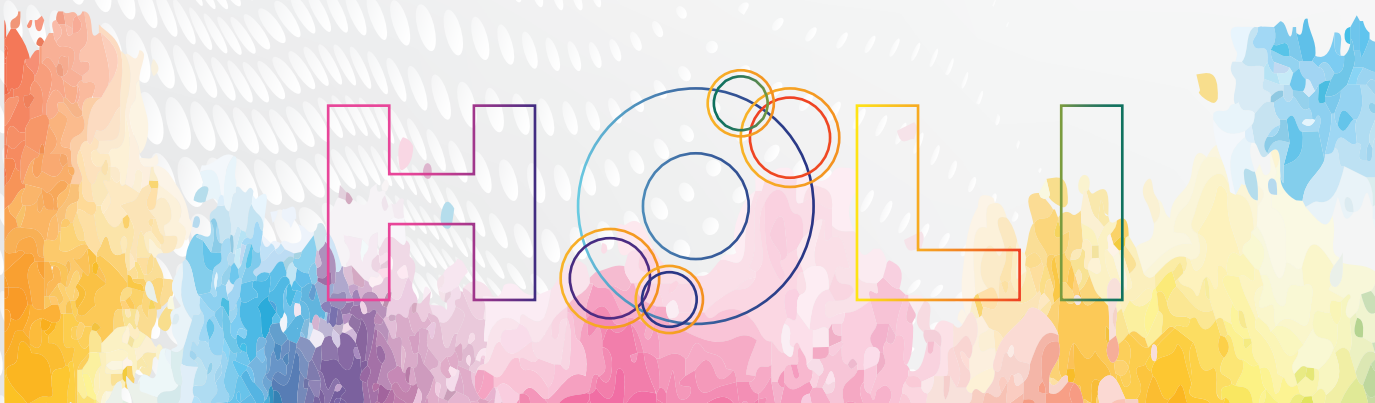

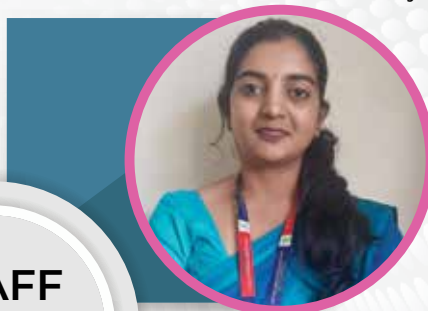

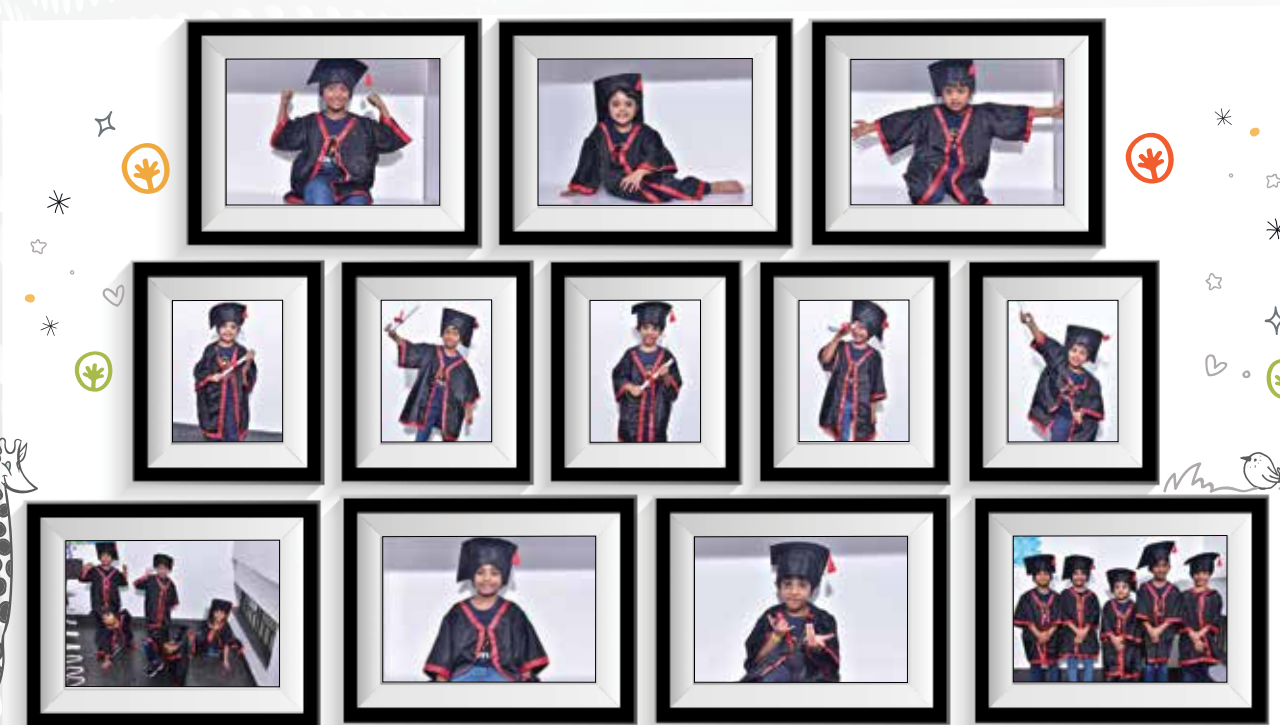
### Cheers to Memories and New Beginnings!
